

## **Healthcare Access**

Accessing healthcare as a new immigrant in the US is important for maintaining your well-being and addressing any medical needs. Here's a guide to help you navigate the healthcare system:

Understanding Healthcare in the US: Familiarize yourself with the US healthcare system, which can be complex. In the US, healthcare is typically provided through private health insurance, government-funded programs, or a combination of both.

Employer-Sponsored Health Insurance: If you're employed, check if your employer offers health insurance benefits. Many employers provide health insurance coverage to full-time employees as part of their compensation package.

Health Insurance Marketplace: If you're not eligible for employer-sponsored health insurance, you can purchase health insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace (HealthCare.gov). Open enrollment periods allow you to sign up for coverage, or you may qualify for special enrollment if you experience a qualifying life event such as moving to a new state or losing other health coverage.

Medicaid: Medicaid is a government-funded program that provides free or low-cost health insurance coverage to eligible low-income individuals and families. Eligibility criteria vary by state, so check with your state's Medicaid office to see if you qualify and how to apply. Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP): CHIP provides low-cost health insurance coverage for children in families that earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but cannot afford private insurance. Eligibility criteria also vary by state.


Community Health Centers: Community health centers (CHCs) are nonprofit healthcare facilities that provide comprehensive primary care services, regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. CHCs serve underserved populations and offer sliding-scale fees based on income.

Emergency Medical Care: In case of a medical emergency, you can receive emergency medical treatment at any hospital emergency room, regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. However, emergency care can be expensive, so it's important to seek routine and preventive care to avoid emergencies whenever possible.




Free and Low-Cost Clinics: Some communities have free or low-cost clinics that provide basic medical services, such as check-ups, vaccinations, and treatment for minor illnesses and injuries. These clinics may be run by nonprofit organizations, religious institutions, or local health departments.

Navigating the Healthcare System: If you're unsure how to access healthcare services or need assistance navigating the healthcare system, consider reaching out to local social service organizations, community health advocates, or immigrant support groups for guidance and support.

Language Assistance: If English is not your first language, ask about language assistance services at healthcare facilities, such as interpretation services or multilingual staff. It's important to be able to communicate effectively with healthcare providers to ensure you receive appropriate care.

Remember that maintaining good health is essential for successfully settling into your new life in the US, so prioritize your healthcare needs and seek assistance if you encounter any barriers to accessing care.





### **MEDICAL NEEDS**

- Call the Covid-19 dedicated line at Lexington's Health Department, 859-899-2222, in Spanish or other languages.
- Mission Lexington (also known as the Faith Based Pharmacy) offers medical, vision, dental, and pharmacy services to adults living in Fayette county and without insurance. They do not see children. Appointments are required. Their medical clinic is located at 230 S Martin Luther King Boulevard, Lexington, KY 40508. The clinic is open Mon Wed, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. For more information, go to <a href="https://missionhealthlex.org/#services">https://missionhealthlex.org/#services</a>, or call 859-272-0219.
- HealthFirst Bluegrass offers medical and dental services for adults and children on a sliding scale fee. Clients whose monthly income is 100% or less of the Federal Poverty Guidelines will be charged \$20 per visit. 
vaccinations. They also support children's mental well-being, dental health, and dietary educational needs. They are located at 1590 Harrodsburg Road, Lexington, KY, 40504 (Next to St. Joseph Hospital) and their phone number is (859) 278-1781.

- UK College of Dentistry dental students, under the supervision of faculty and resident dentists, will see patients ages 4-12 years old to offer free dental examinations, cleanings, radiographs, sealants, simple restorative work and extractions, and fluoride varnish. Free kindergarten screenings will also be provided. You must pre-register online before going at: https://dentistry.uky.edu/patient-care/appointment-request. Call: 859-323-3368.






